UNIVERSITY/COLLEGE OPEN DAYS

There are a large number of University Open Days this term. Make sure you have drawn up your short list of those you wish to visit. A list is contained both in this Careers News and your Calendar and Fixture list. This can be an expensive business so purchase a student rail card and book your transport early. Coach travel is **much** cheaper but will you get there in time?

Many universities/colleges require you to book a place at their Open Day, make sure you do this **NOW**. Some Open Days at Russell Group Universities are **VERY** busy indeed. You are reminded that you are only permitted to attend two Open Days during school time so look out for Open Days on Saturdays and after the end of term. If you are taking a day off school to attend an Open Day you must complete the pink form 'Notice of 6th Form Absence to Attend Open Day' -these are obtainable from your tutor or the Careers Centre. You must give five working days notice and all your teachers/tutor must approve the absence. Forms should be returned to **YOUR TUTOR**. Today your tutor will give you some guidelines on how to prepare for an Open Day and how to get the most out of your visit.
