The London Taster Course Programme aims to provide students looking towards starting university in September 2012 (students who are currently in year 12) with the opportunity to experience a taste of London university life. Students can choose from a wide variety of subjects and will be given the opportunity to experience lectures and seminar discussion groups, to participate in practical activities, and to meet with academic staff teaching the courses and current students.
