

Junior Sixth Spanish Easter Revision

1. **Oral exam:** Make sure that you have fully prepared your answers to all the questions likely to come up. See the information sheet on the website about the format of the exam to make sure that you know exactly what to expect at each stage. Use the Nelson Thornes Learning Space site (see below for details).
2. **Vocabulary:** absolutely vital so revise as much as possible, mainly from your own notes, but supplemented also the material on the Nelson Thornes Learning Space site (see below for details).

4. **General reading:** anything at all (newspapers, magazines, internet, e.g. www.20minutos.es).
5. **Nelson Thornes Learning Space:** This is the online material attached to your coursebook. Go to <http://learningspace.nelsonthornes.com>. You will be asked for a username, password and organisation code. Your username is your school log-on (unless you are in Mrs Smith's French set, in which case it is the first five letters of your surname and the first three letters of your first name e.g. bloggjos for Joseph Bloggs). The password is chorizo. The organisation code is 8906.
I would particularly recommend the Support and Assessment section, where you will find the Vocabulary Builder section and, in separate folders, sections entitled On Your Marks and Examiner's Tips. I would prefer you not to attempt the Examination-style questions as we shall use them in class, although you may like to look at the ones for the oral exam.
