

## Third Form Revision Advice.

The exam you will sit in the summer will cover all of the work that you have done this year. It will be a straightforward exam and you should not be unduly worried. The essays and work that you have done this year will stand you in good stead.

The topics that you will be tested on are:

- Religion and Science: Make sure you can define / briefly explain the following terms
  - Intelligent design
  - Creationism
  - Evolution
  - Natural Selection
  - The Big Bang Theory
  - The account of creation in Genesis.
- The cosmological Argument: cause and effect, St Thomas Aquinas.
- The teleological Argument: the argument from design, William Paley and his Watch analogy.
- Ludwig Feuerbach: God is a product of the imagination of man.
- The problem of evil: be able to explain why the existence of evil is a problem for religious believers.
- Responses to the problem of evil: some people argue that evil is a by product of free will, some people argue that the world must be a challenging place.
- The inspirational figures that you have studied.
- Your ability to discuss / assess all of the above.

In order to prepare and to score as well as possible consider the following advice:

- Look over all of your work, and check that your notes are in order.
- Make sure you are familiar with, and able to explain, all of the above topics.
- Try to consider both the facts of certain things, such as the sequence of the cosmological argument, as well as being able to discuss or assess each piece's strengths and weaknesses.
- Consider your own opinion on each topic, be prepared to explain it and your reasons for holding it.
